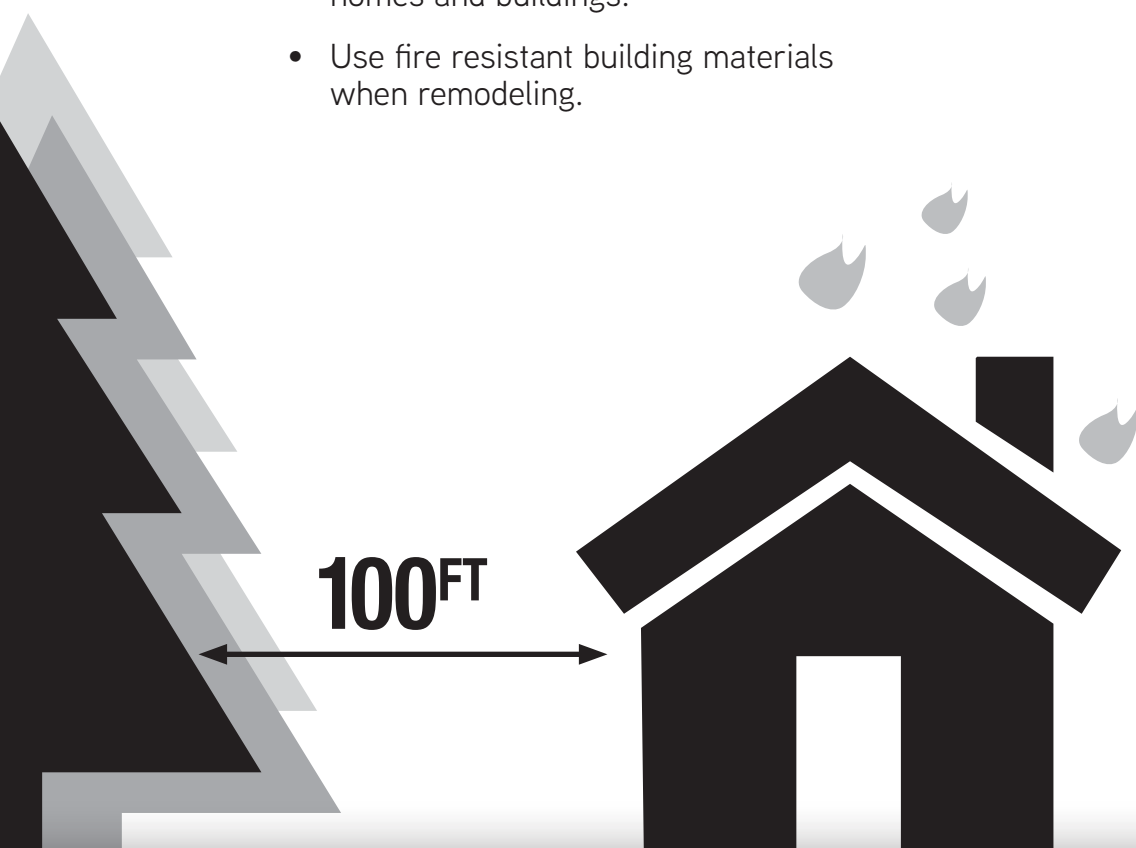


GET READY

- Choose plants that are fire resistant.
- Clean all dead leaves from your roof and rain gutters.
- **Create defensible space.** 100-feet of defensible space is required around homes and buildings.
- Use fire resistant building materials when remodeling.

Include: non-perishable food and water for three days, a first aid kit, tools and supplies, clothing and bedding, important documents, medications, and pet supplies.



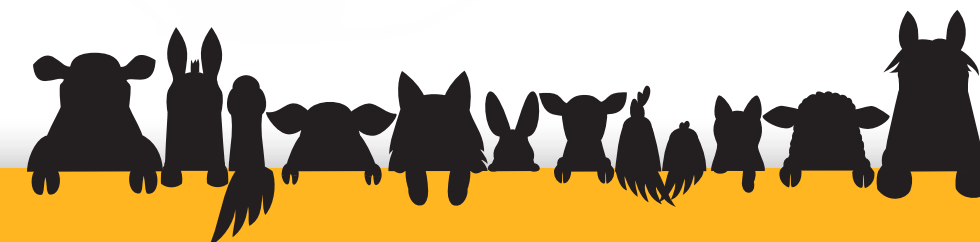
GO!

Evacuate when you receive notice

- Cover-up to protect against heat and flying embers. Wear long pants, a long sleeve shirt, heavy shoes, and cover your face with a bandana or cap. 100% cotton is preferable.
- Double check that your emergency supply kit is in your vehicle.



- Locate your pets and take them with you.



Are you and your pets ready?

- Keep your pet ID current
- Establish two trusted friends who can help care for your pet in case of disaster
- Include food and water for your pet in your emergency supplies
- Familiarize your pet with a carrier or crate.
